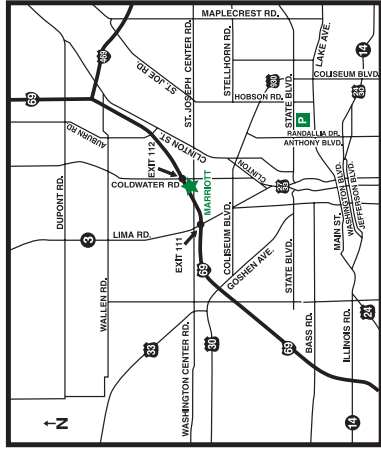

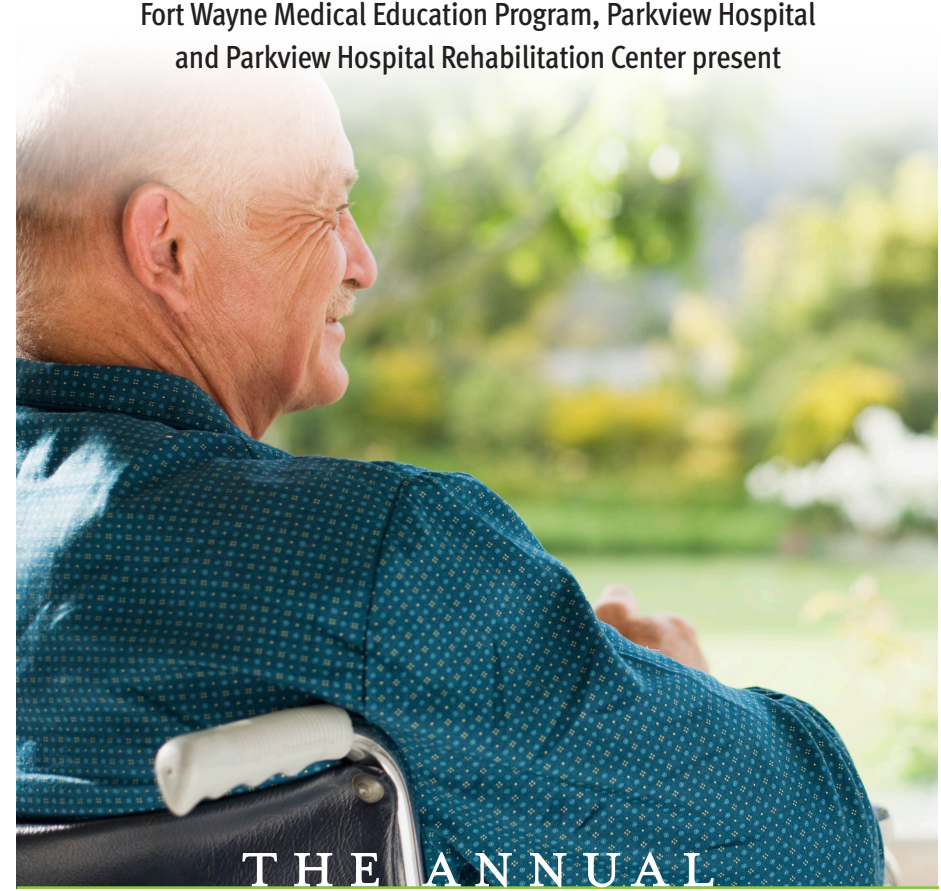

Objectives

9. Learn the benefits of home healthcare services and use of functional activities in the patient's natural environment to facilitate recovery.
10. Understand the importance of respecting and accounting for cultural / religious differences in working with brain injury patients.

About Parkview Hospital Rehabilitation Center

- Located in northeast Indiana, Parkview Hospital is a major acute-care hospital verified as adult and pediatric trauma centers.
- Rehab center is an integral part of Parkview Stanley Wiseman Stroke Center, serving patients who have a variety of neurological and orthopaedic diseases and injuries.
- Rehab center offers a coordinated team approach and expert staff, including 15 staff members certified by the Academy of Certified Brain Injury Specialists.

CARE (the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities) three-year accreditation was awarded to the rehab center in summer 2009 for:

- Comprehensive Inpatient Medical Rehabilitation Program (child/adolescent and adult) — accredited continuously since 1978
- Stroke Program — first time accreditation was sought
- Brain Injury Program (child/adolescent and adult) — accredited continuously since 1988

Only 3 percent of all CARE-reviewed programs met all standards. The above programs were among that distinguished 3 percent.
