



## Parkview Hospital Rehab Program Acquired Brain Injury Outcomes for 2008

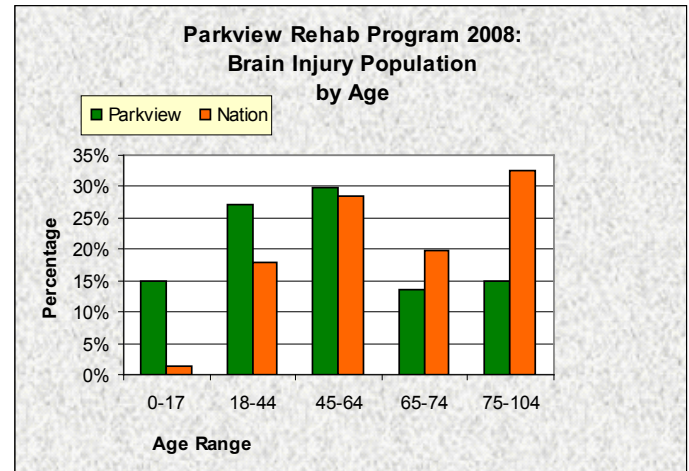
The Parkview Rehabilitation Center is a state-of-the-art inpatient medical rehabilitation program located within Parkview Hospital. The program is accredited for comprehensive and brain injury by CARF (the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities). Parkview Hospital is home to a verified Level II Trauma Center, and its Parkview Stanley Wissman Stroke Center is certified through The Joint Commission. The Rehab Program provides a full range of inpatient services and programs to support patients being treated at the Level II Trauma Center and the certified primary stroke center. Our goal is to help patients in their recovery from an illness or trauma that interferes with their ability to move, think and care for themselves. Our experienced staff cares for patients age 3 and older.

### FUNCTIONAL IMPROVEMENT

#### Meeting goals

At admission, the patients and families actively participate in setting goals for their stay. They meet with their other team members weekly to review progress toward those goals.

**On average, patients within the Brain Injury Program met 80 percent of their long-term goals in 2008.**

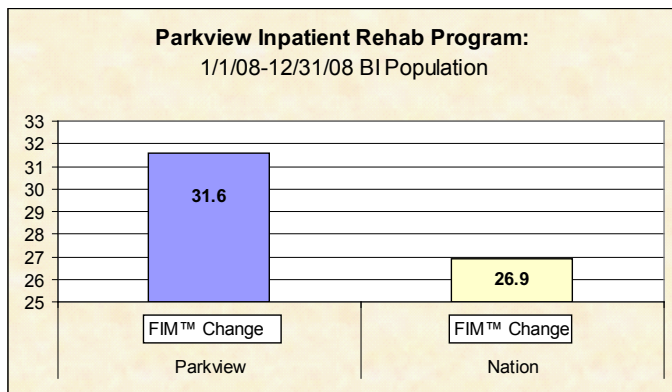

#### Functional status

The following graphs compare functional status on admission, discharge and the change compared to the national average.

## FUNCTIONAL IMPROVEMENT (continued)

Improvement in function is measured by the Functional Independence Measure (FIM™) instrument. The FIM instrument contains 18 functional areas: eating, grooming, bathing, dressing upper body, dressing lower body, toileting, bladder management, bowel management, basic transfers, toilet transfers, tub/shower transfers, walking/wheelchair use, stairs, comprehension, expression, social interaction, problem-solving and memory. Each area is measured with a scale from 1 (representing “dependent”) through 7 (representing “independent”).

### Average number of therapy hours received

Patients received, on average, 3.5 hours of physical, occupational and/or speech therapy per day.

## LENGTH OF STAY AND LENGTH-OF-STAY EFFICIENCY

The average length of time (in days) that a patient spends in the Parkview Rehab Program is slightly higher than the national average.

The length-of-stay efficiency reflects the amount of progress in function a patient makes in comparison to the number of days he or she spends in the program. The higher the number, the higher the efficiency.

## RETURN-TO-COMMUNITY RATE

Another measure of quality is the percentage of patients who are discharged to their homes or to other community settings, rather than to a skilled nursing or hospital setting. On average, 68 percent of our patients were discharged into a community setting.

### Three months post-discharge
