



## Parkview Rehabilitation Center Acquired Brain Injury Outcomes for 2010

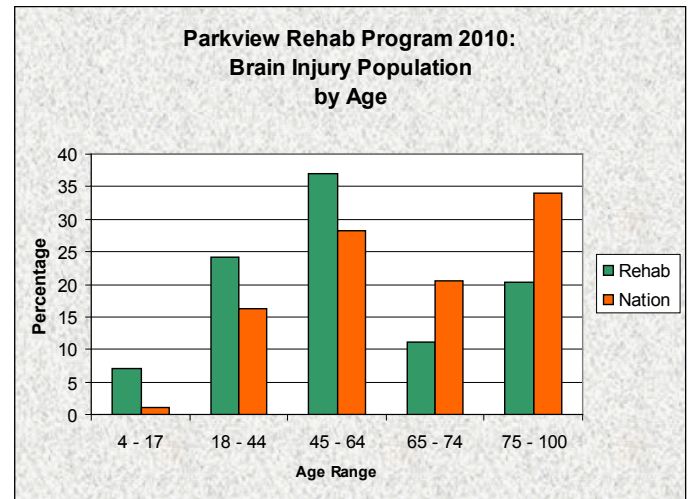
The Parkview Rehabilitation Center is a state-of-the-art, comprehensive inpatient medical rehabilitation program accredited by CARF (the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities). The program is in the top 3 percent of facilities accredited by CARF and is located within Parkview Hospital. The hospital is home to verified Adult and Pediatric Trauma Centers and the Parkview Stanley Wissman Stroke Center, certified through The Joint Commission. The Rehab Center provides a full range of inpatient services and programs to support patients at the Trauma Centers and the certified primary stroke center. Our goal is to help patients in their recovery from an illness or trauma that interferes with their ability to move, think and care for themselves. Our experienced staff includes 12 certified brain injury specialists who work as a team to provide care for patients age 3 and older.

### FUNCTIONAL IMPROVEMENT

#### Meeting goals

At admission, the patients and families actively participate in setting goals for their stay. They meet with their other team members weekly to review progress toward those goals.

**On average, patients within the Brain Injury Program met 82 percent of their long-term goals in 2010.**

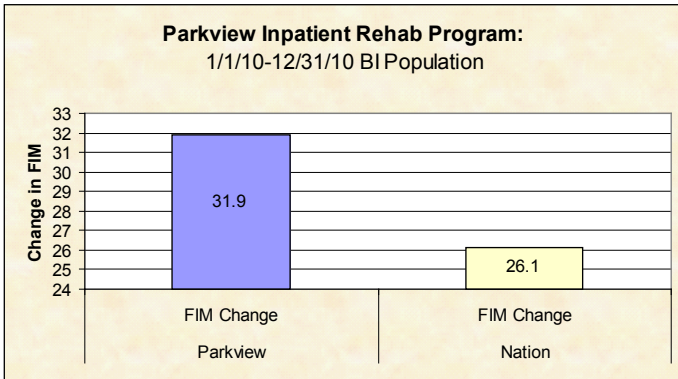

#### Functional status

The following graphs compare functional status at admission and at discharge, as well as the change compared to the national average.

## FUNCTIONAL IMPROVEMENT (continued)

Improvement in function is measured by the Functional Independence Measure (FIM™) instrument. The FIM instrument contains 18 functional areas: eating, grooming, bathing, dressing upper body, dressing lower body, toileting, bladder management, bowel management, basic transfers, toilet transfers, tub/shower transfers, walking/wheelchair use, stairs, comprehension, expression, social interaction, problem-solving and memory. Each area is measured with a scale from 1 (representing “dependent”) through 7 (representing “independent”).

### Average number of therapy hours received

Patients received, on average, 3.5 hours of physical, occupational and/or speech therapy per day.

### Functional status three months post-discharge

- 98.4 percent of our patients maintained function or did better than their status at discharge.
- Compared to national 93.7 percent.

## LENGTH OF STAY AND LENGTH-OF-STAY EFFICIENCY

The average length of time (in days) that a patient spends in the Parkview Rehabilitation Center is slightly higher than the national average.

The length-of-stay efficiency reflects the amount of progress in function a patient makes in comparison to the number of days he or she spends in the program. The higher the number, the higher the efficiency.

## RETURN-TO-COMMUNITY RATE

Another measure of quality is the percentage of patients who are discharged to their homes or to other community settings, rather than to a skilled nursing or hospital setting.

### Three months post-discharge

At three-month contact, of 21 patients who had been discharged from our program to a non-community setting, 17 had subsequently been discharged into a community setting.

## PATIENT SATISFACTION

### Discharge

At discharge, 89 percent of patients with brain injury identified their overall satisfaction with their experience as “excellent” or “very good.”

### Three months post-discharge
