Organizational Structure: Charitable, not-for-profit, community-owned hospital; member of Parkview Health since January 1, 2015

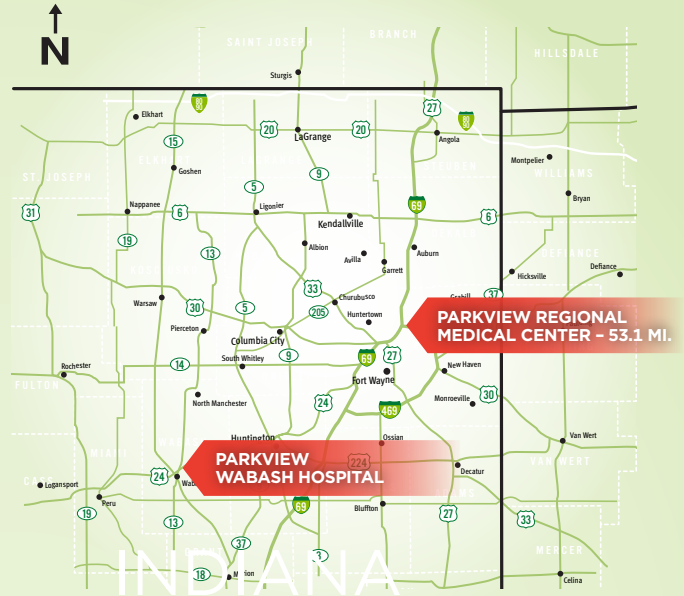
Size/Campus: The campus includes a two-story, 82,000-square-foot hospital and a 31,000-square-foot medical office building, home to Parkview Physicians Group offices and services. The hospital features a user-friendly design and includes an on-site pharmacy, chapel, café, and gift shop.

SERVICES

- **Emergency Department:** staffed 24 hours a day, 365 days a year by board-certified physicians, physician assistants, registered nurses, and patient care technicians who are trained in emergency medicine and care. Includes nine patient care rooms plus a triage room. The patient care rooms include a trauma room and a “safe room” for patients who may be experiencing a behavioral health crisis.
- **Surgery:** two surgical suites and six private preop/postop rooms. Surgical services include general surgery, urology, endoscopy, podiatry, gynecology, orthopedics, and colorectal. Laparoscopic and endoscopic procedures performed, and 24-hour coverage provided.
- **Medical/Surgical/CCU:** 18 inpatient rooms equipped with “smart beds” and a central monitoring system. Physicians can speak with and monitor patients remotely, access chart information, and provide diagnoses.
- **Continuing Care Program:** combines 24-hour skilled nursing care with rehabilitation therapies to help patients transition back home or to a long-term care facility following surgery or an illness. The focus is to help the patient regain strength, mobility and independence, while assessing the services or equipment needed to attain those goals. Services provided are similar to those received during an inpatient hospital stay—nursing care 24/7, rehab therapy, wound care, easy access to lab and imaging services, and more.
- **Rehabilitation Services:** cardiac and pulmonary rehabilitation provided. Inpatient and swing-bed rehabilitation includes physical, occupational, and speech therapy. Outpatient physical and occupational therapy, aquatic rehab, and speech therapy are available at the Rehab Place of Parkview Wabash Hospital, located at the Wabash County YMCA.
- **ATU Clinic:** assists patients on bloodthinning medication by monitoring and adjusting dosing therapy.
- **Outpatient Infusion:** serves ambulatory patients who need intravenous chemotherapy, intravenous hydration, blood transfusions, immunotherapy, and antibiotic infusions.
- **Diagnostic Services:** offers a wide range of outpatient services from advanced diagnostic imaging—including CT, EEG, MRI, echocardiogram, and nuclear medicine—Bronchial Challenge Testing, HeartSmart and Smart lung screening, 3D mammography, bone-density scanning and ultrasound. We also offer pulmonary function testing, cardiac monitoring and treadmill testing, and EKG, plus a full-service laboratory.
- **Physician Specialty Clinics:** cardiology, endocrinology, neurology, pain management, obstetrics and gynecology, oncology, orthopedics, podiatry, pulmonology, urology, virtual rheumatology, general surgery, and sleep medicine.
- **Sleep Center:** on-site diagnosis and treatment of sleep-related disorders. Generous room amenities offered for patient comfort during overnight sleep studies. Home sleep studies are also available.
- **Behavioral Health Services:** offers outpatient alcohol and opioid dependency medication treatment (MAT) and intensive outpatient (IOP) group therapy. After patients complete IOP, there is outpatient group treatment, which provides a continuation of care as we walk alongside participants until they reach their desired outcomes.
- **Senior Mental Health Program (LifeBridge):** LifeBridge offers a “whole-person” approach to improving emotional well-being for Medicare recipients. We have psychiatrists (MD) to prescribe and manage medications, licensed mental health clinicians for counseling service and RNs for coordination of care.



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
