- As a not-for-profit hospital system, Parkview Health is responsible for conducting a CHNA every 3 years for each community served by a Parkview Hospital. The last CHNA was completed in 2022.
- Data from the CHNA is used to identify priority health needs in the communities we serve and is integral to Parkview's community health improvement strategies and investments.

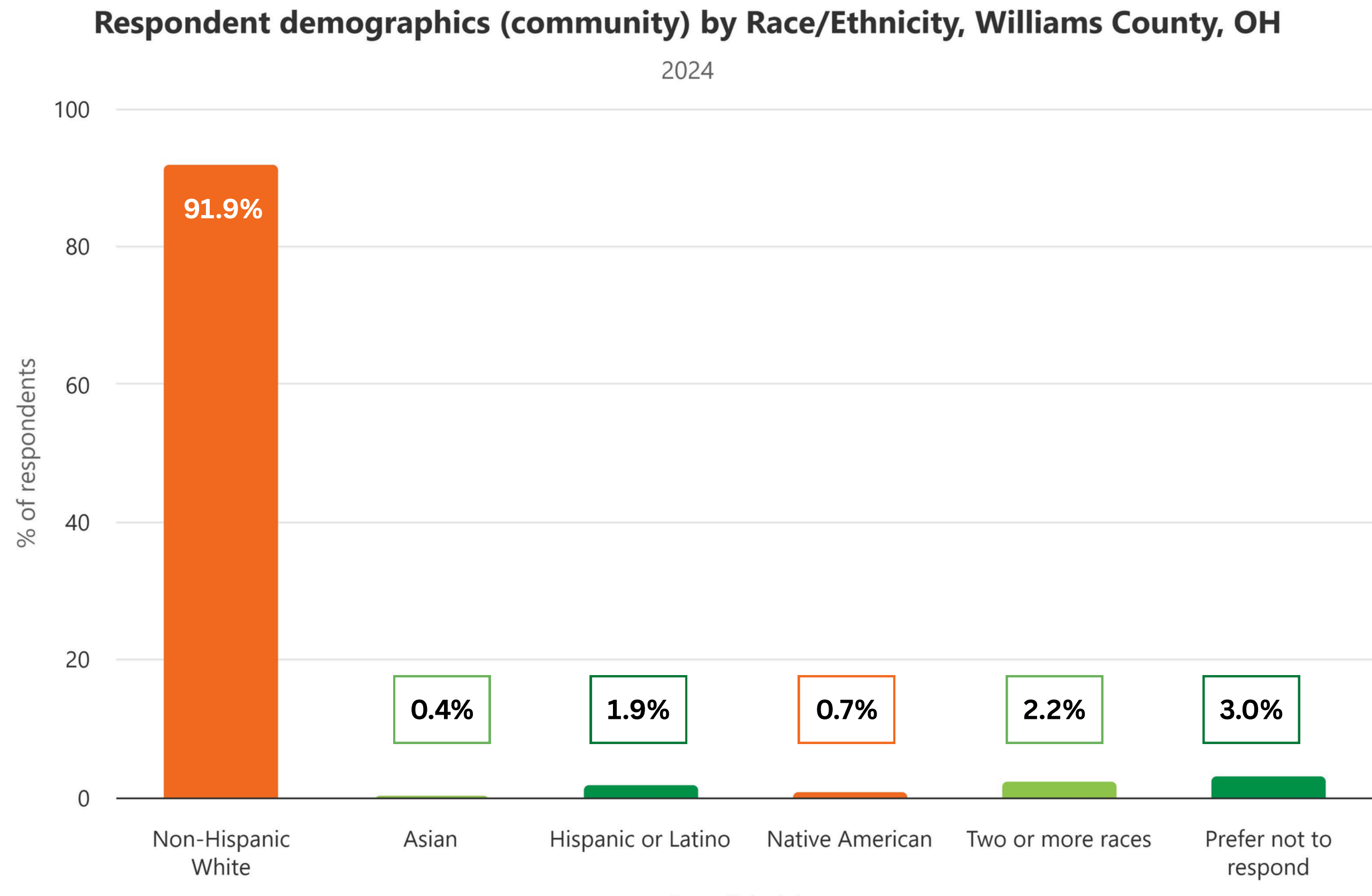

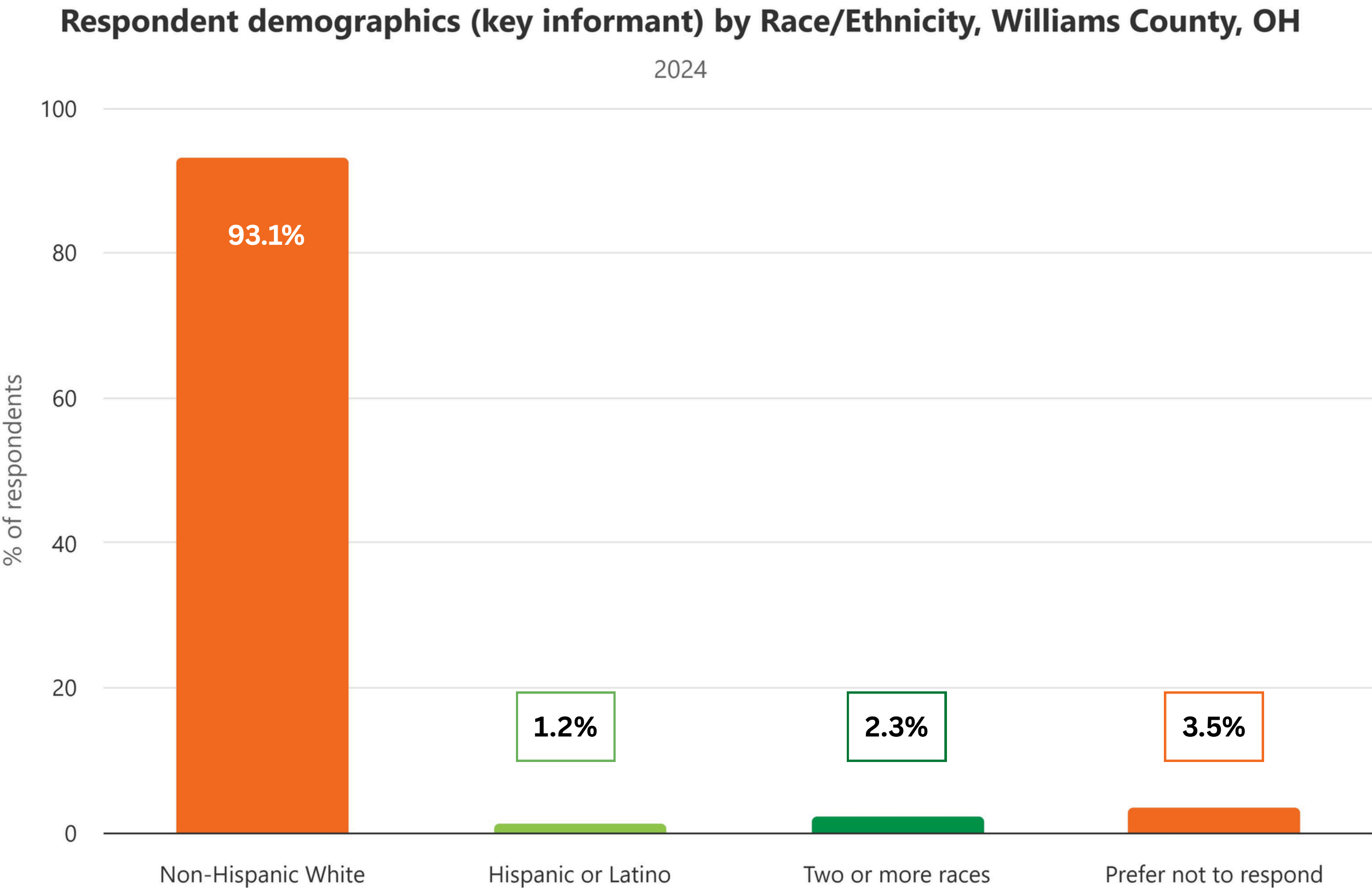
Community Survey: Race/ethnicity of respondents in Williams County

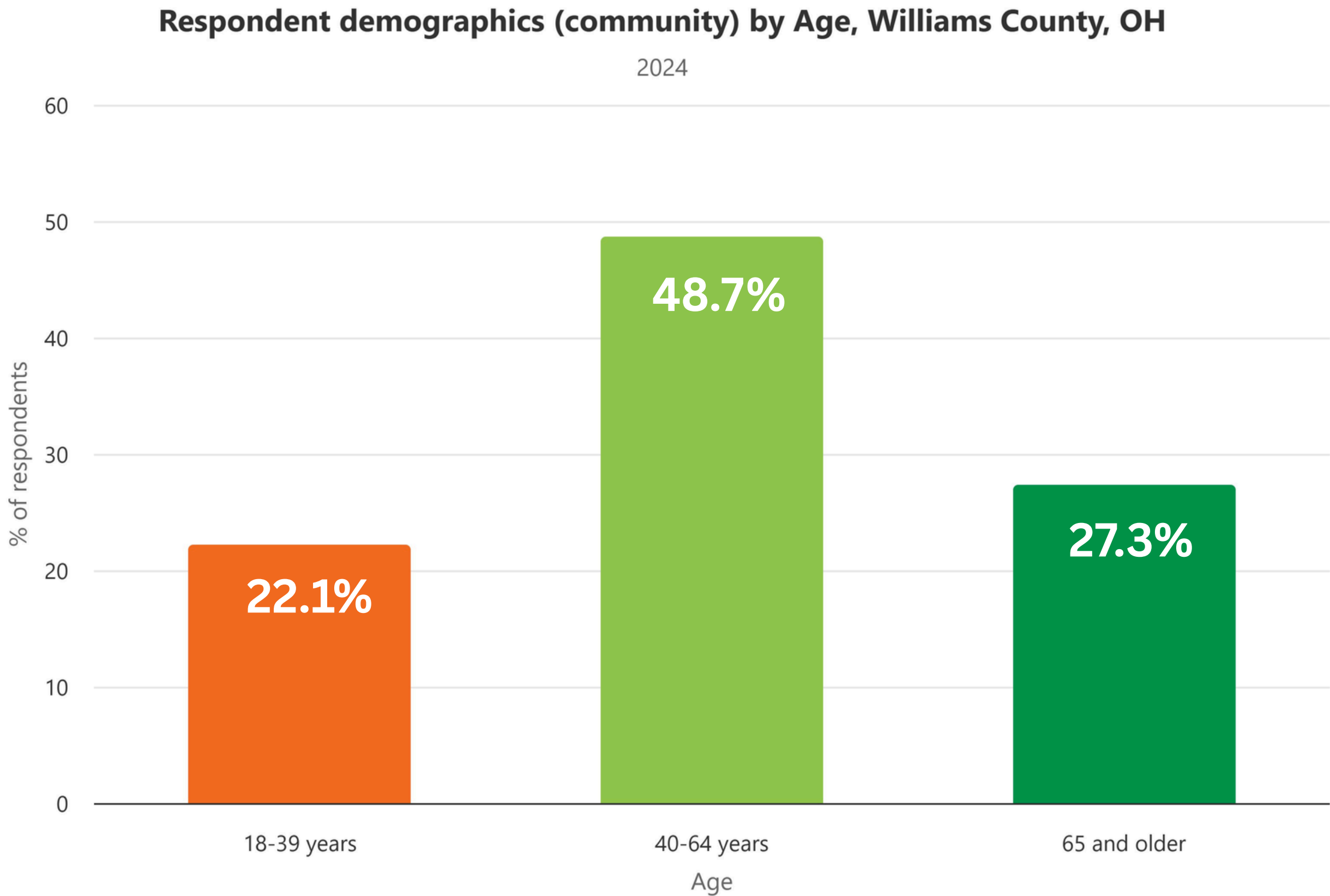

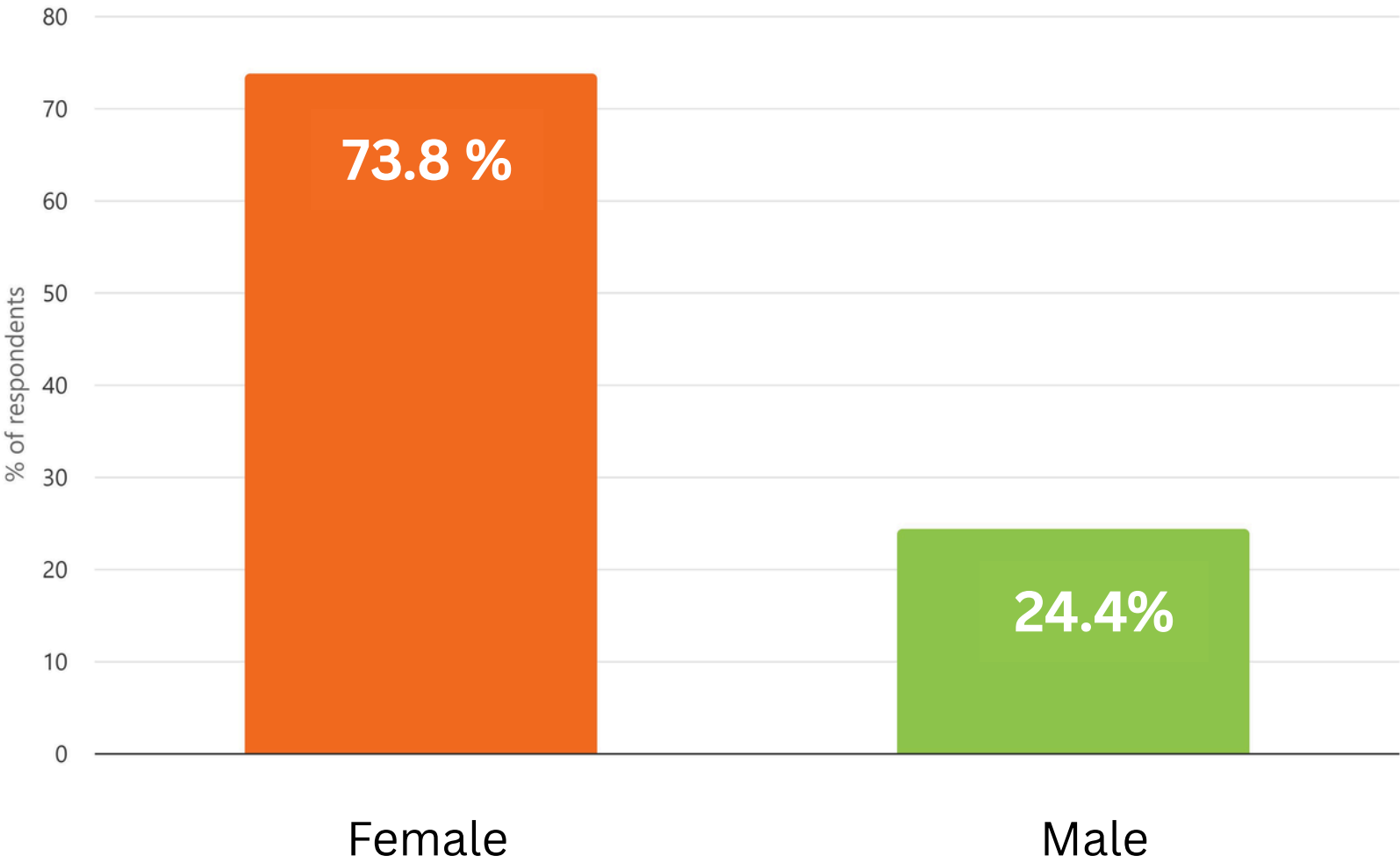

A note on secondary data



You may notice that some of the numbers presented differ from what was seen in earlier presentations. Why?

- Public health data are not static. Agencies like the CDC continue to receive new reports, verify information and improve analytic methods even after data are first published.
- When this happens, previously reported numbers may be updated.
- These updates are normal and reflect stronger, more complete information.
- Updates usually **do not** change the actual severity of public health issues.

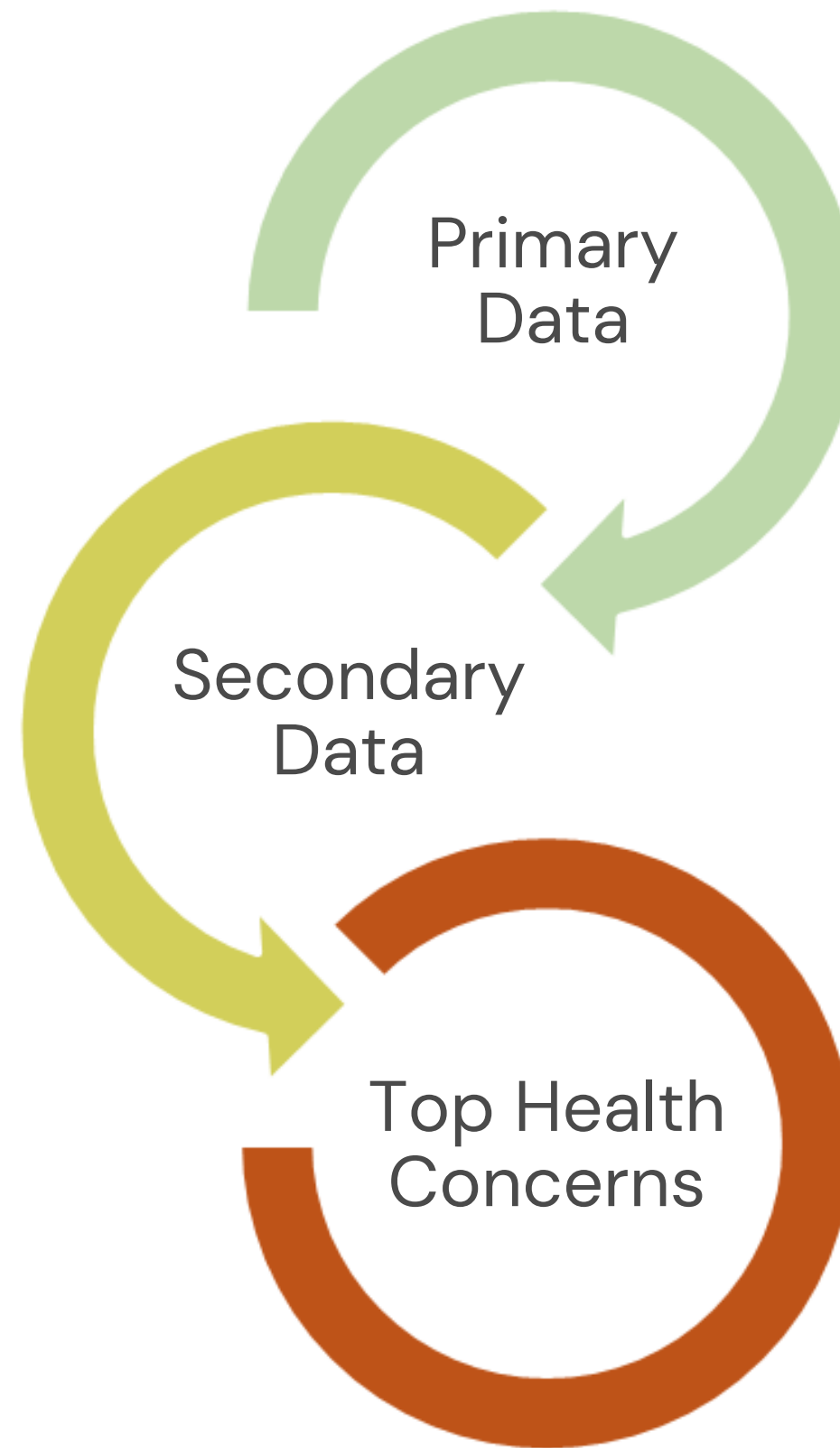

- Higher scores indicate greater need

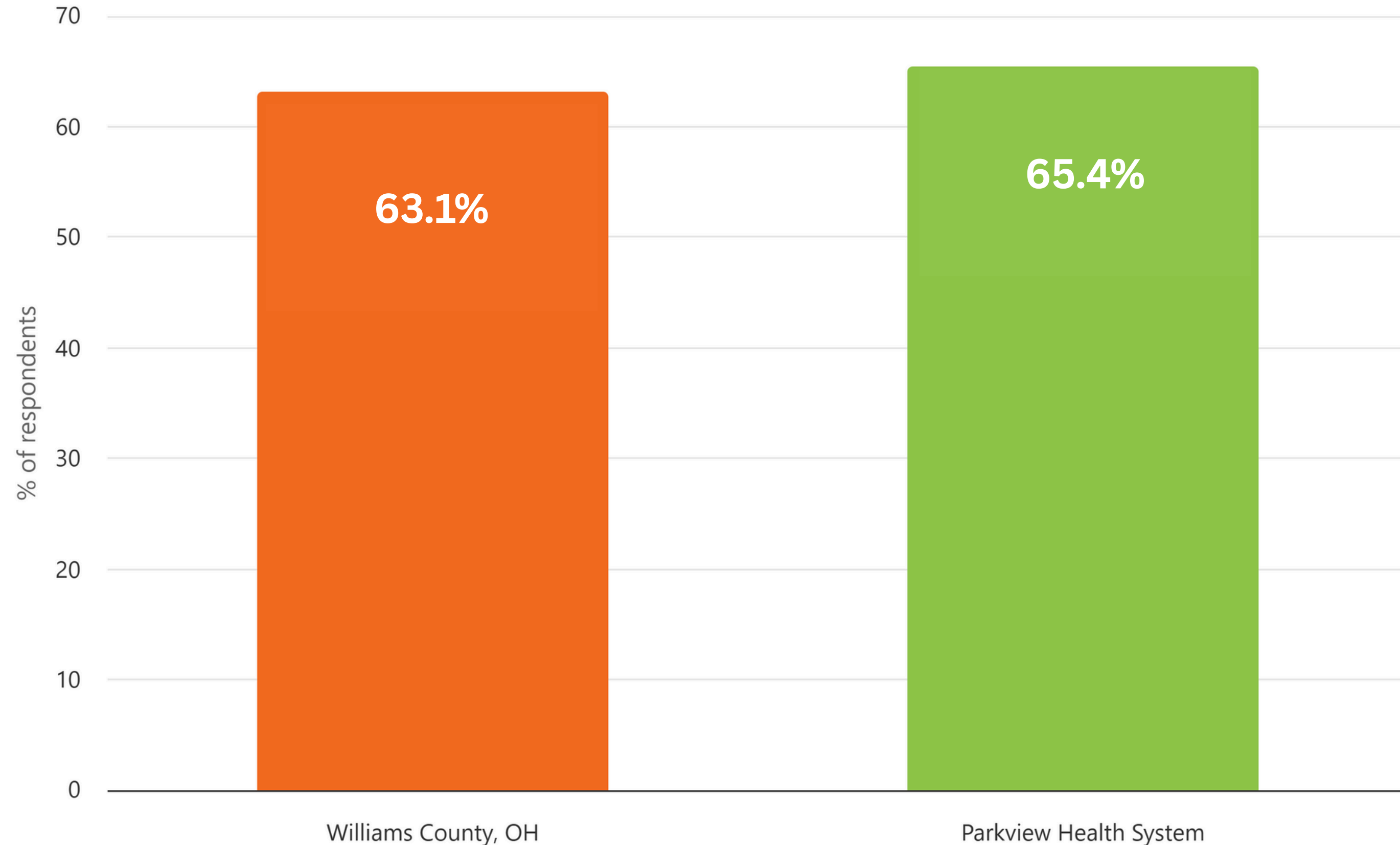

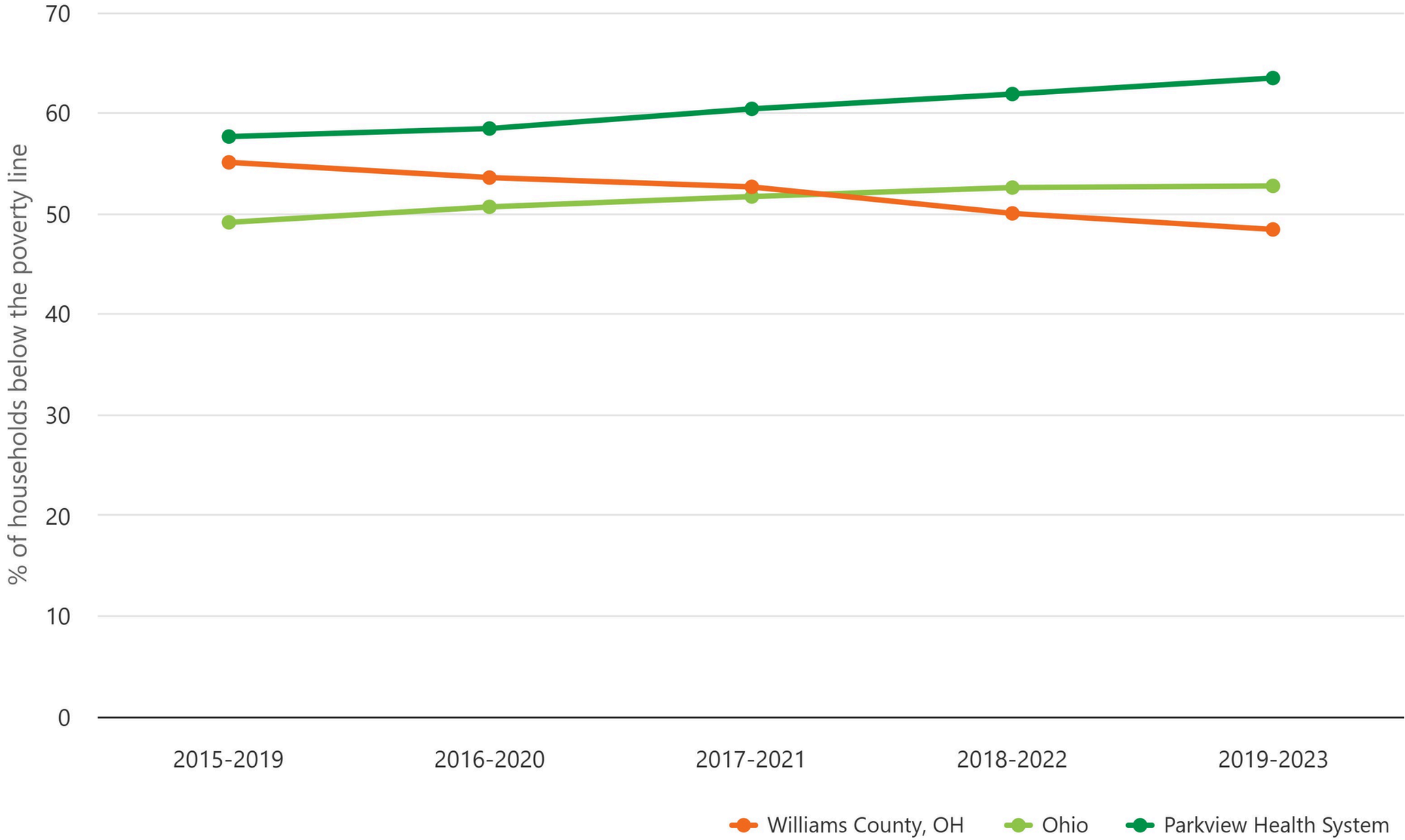

Households in Poverty not Receiving Food Stamps (2019–2023)

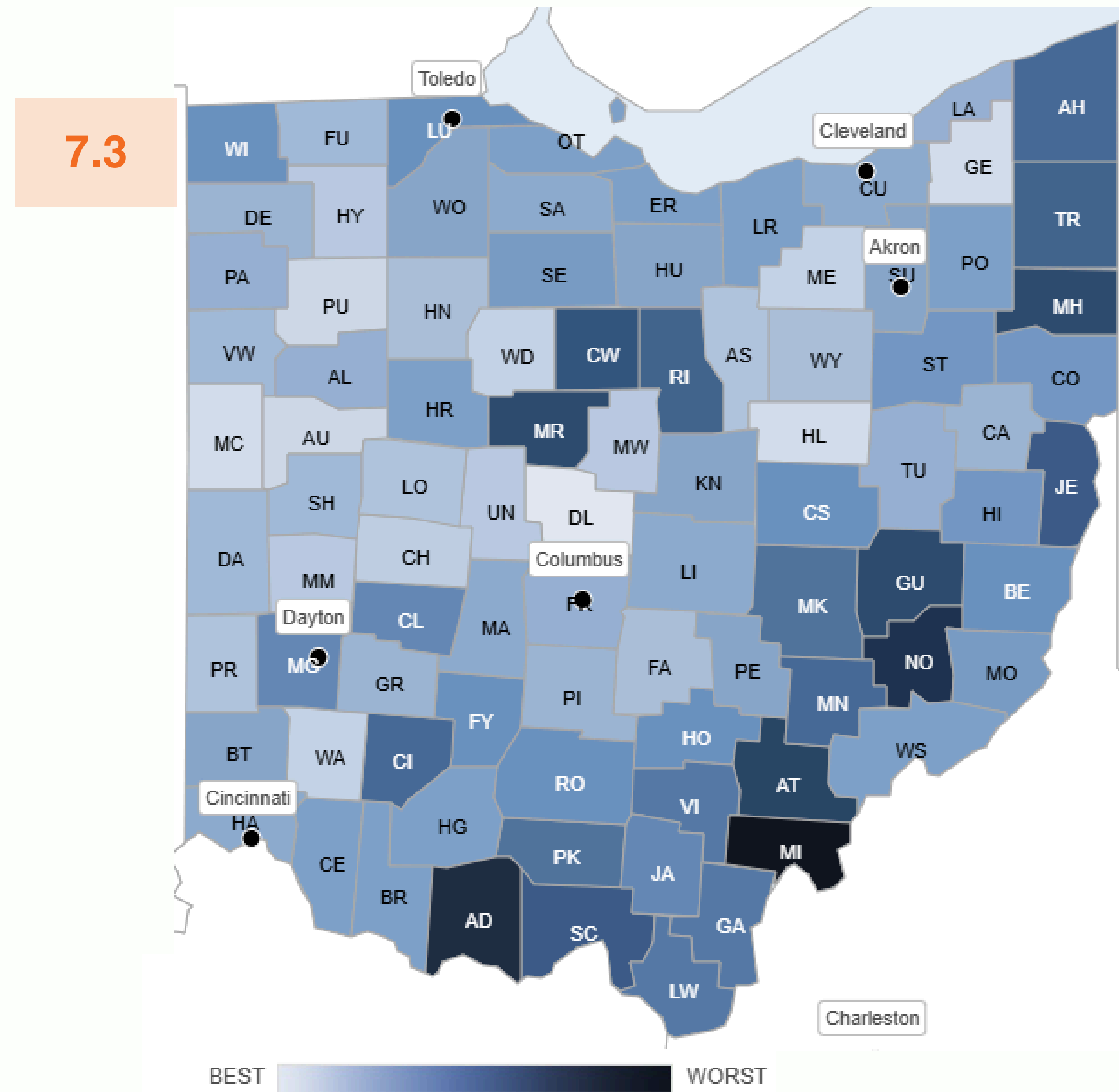


Food Environment Index

The Food Environment Index ranges from a scale of 0 (worst) to 10 (best) and equally weights two indicators of the food environment:

- 1) Limited access to healthy foods
- 2) Food Insecurity

Summary of Community Survey Data and Local Health Statistics

Affordable and Healthy Food

- Food insecurity is on the rise and disparities exist by race/ethnicity, with **20%** of the Hispanic/Latino population experiencing limited or uncertain access to adequate food.
 - The percentage of households in poverty not receiving food stamps is steadily decreasing for Williams County, though significant disparities exist by zip code
 - Zip codes of particular concern are **43501**, **43517**, and **43518**

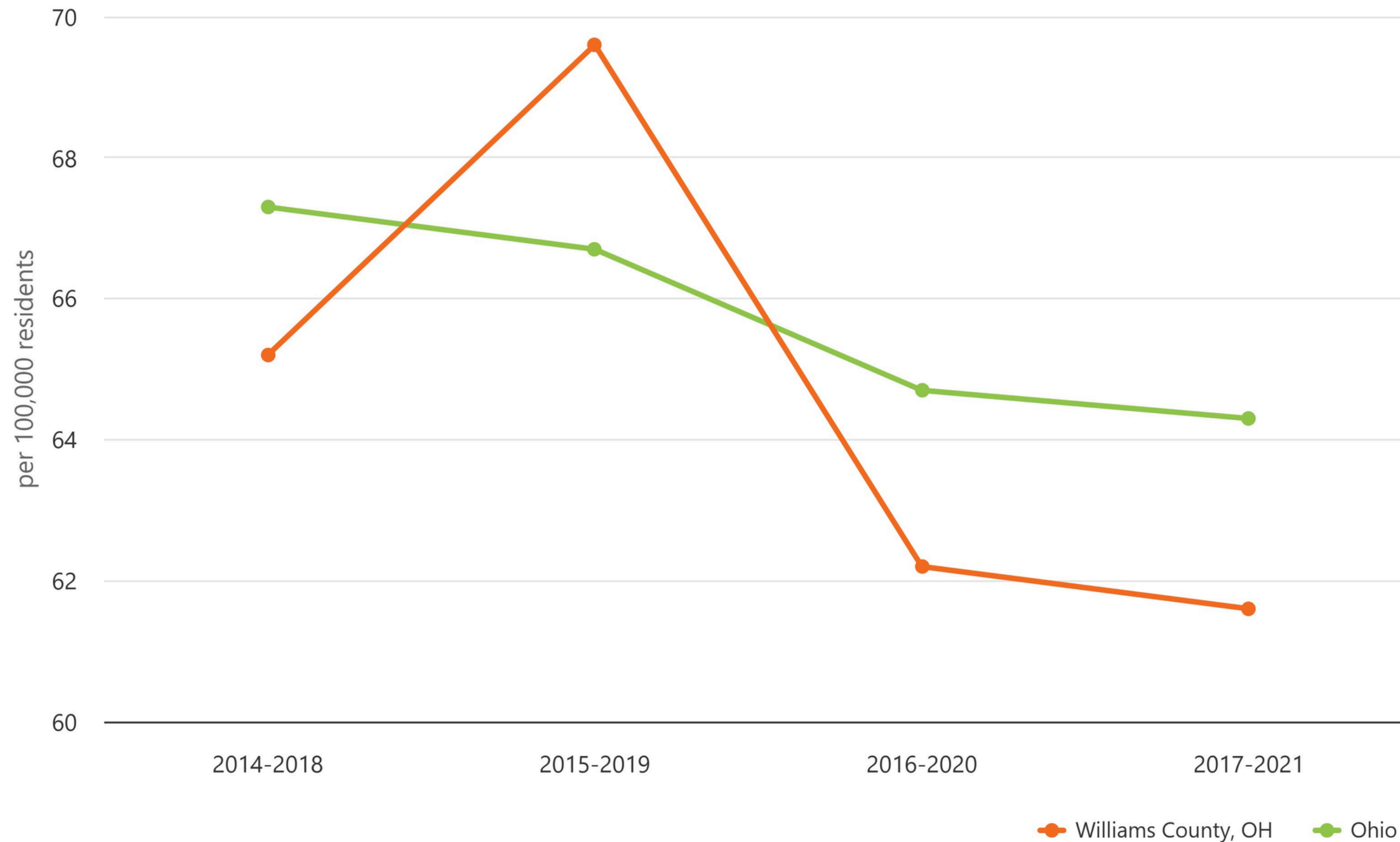

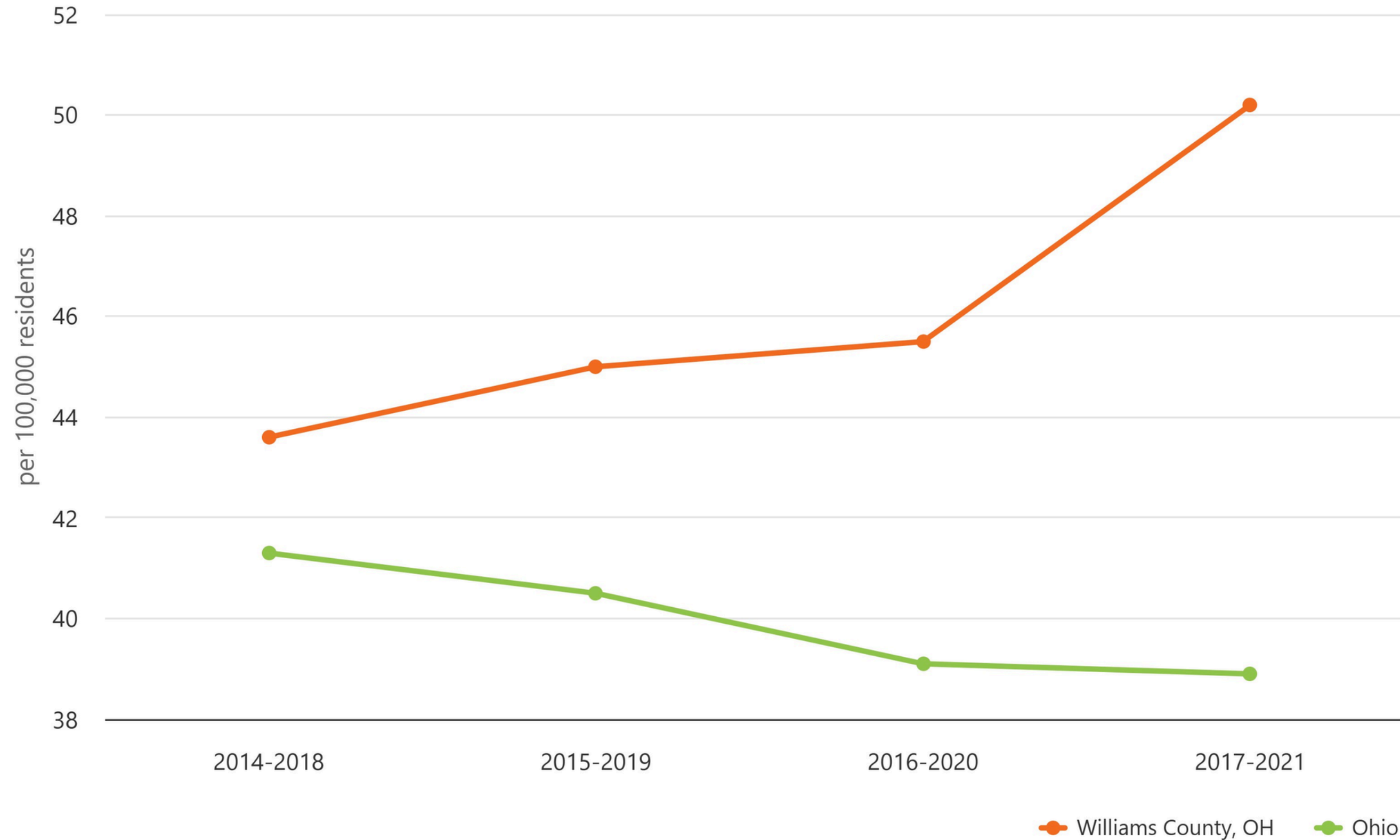

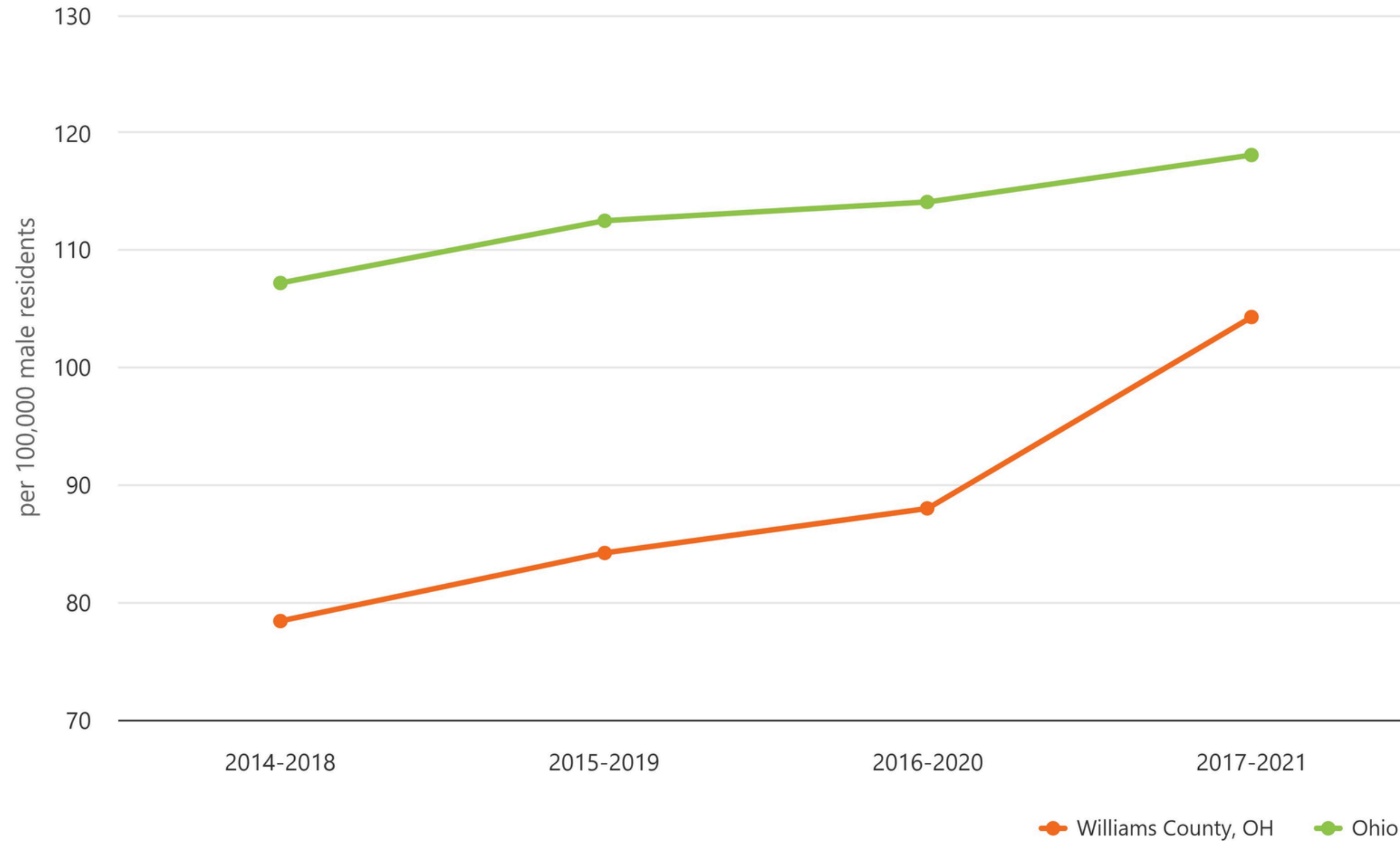

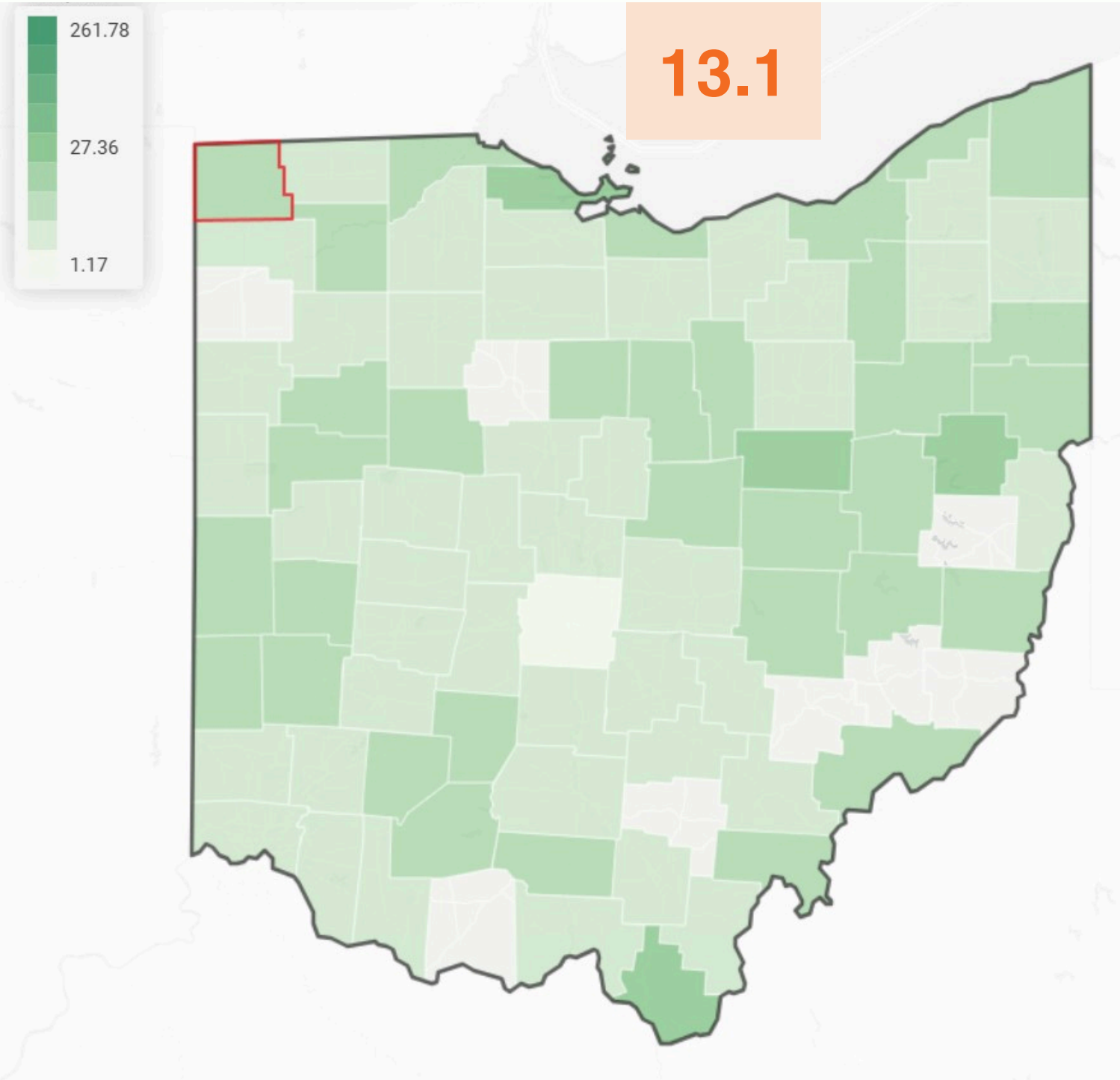
Prostate cancer mortality, 2019-2023

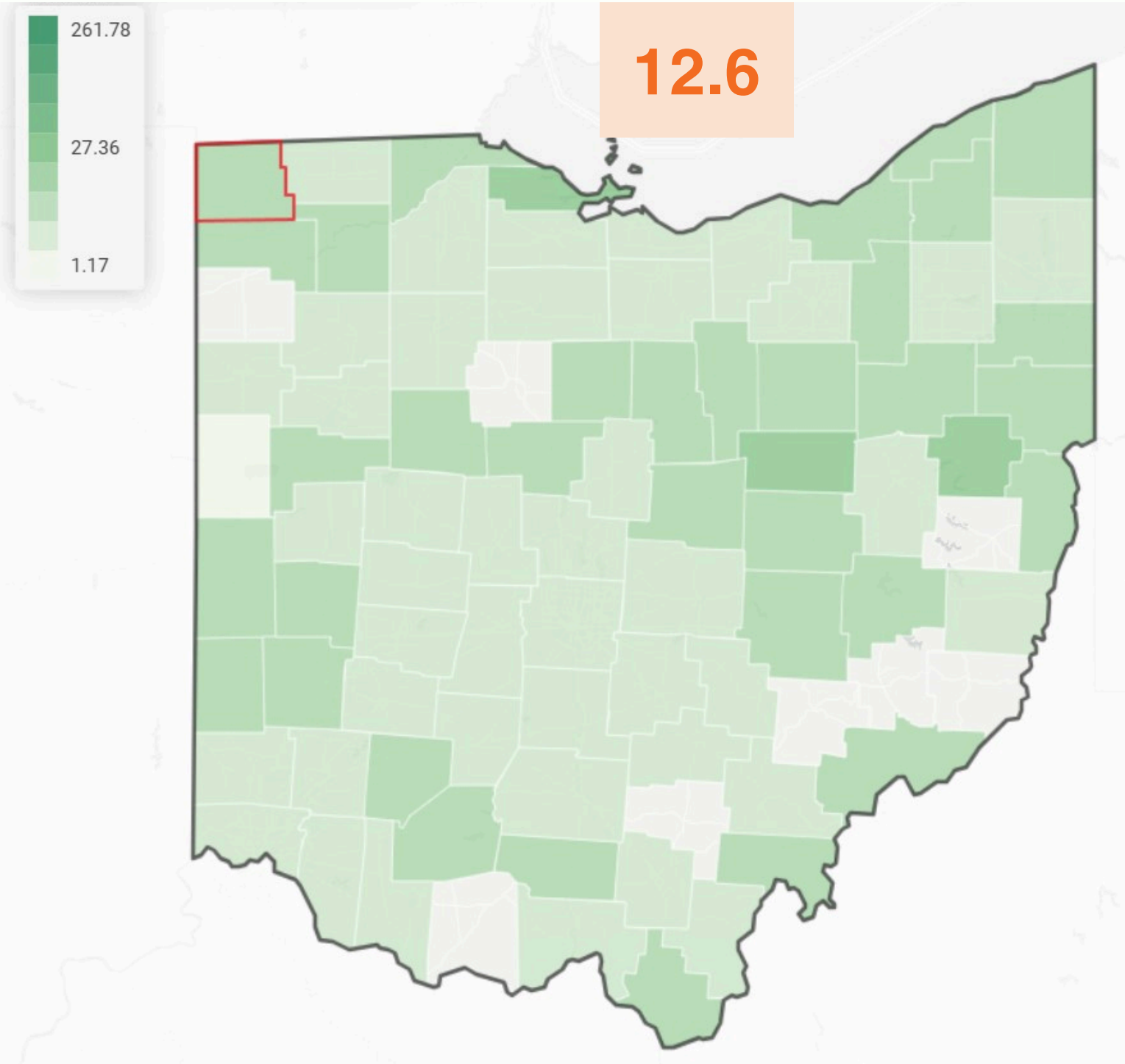


Prostate Cancer Mortality

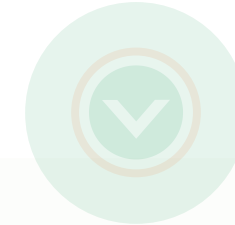
Cancers

- Cancer diagnoses and mortality rates are on the rise in Williams County and are higher than the rates for the Parkview Health System and Ohio.
 - Though mortality rates from breast cancer and colorectal cancer are decreasing, diagnosis rates are on the rise.
 - Mortality from lung, trachea, and bronchus cancer is significantly higher in Williams County (**60.0 deaths per 100,000 residents**) compared to Ohio (38.6 deaths per 100,000 residents).

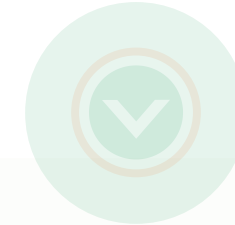
Mental Health and Mental Disorders

- Several measures of mental health conditions are on the rise in Williams County (*e.g., suicide mortality, depression, and poor mental health.*)
 - Suicide mortality is higher in Williams County compared to Ohio and appears to have been steadily increasing since 2015 based on 5-year average data.
 - Zip codes of particular concern for adult depression in Williams County are **43543** and **43554**.

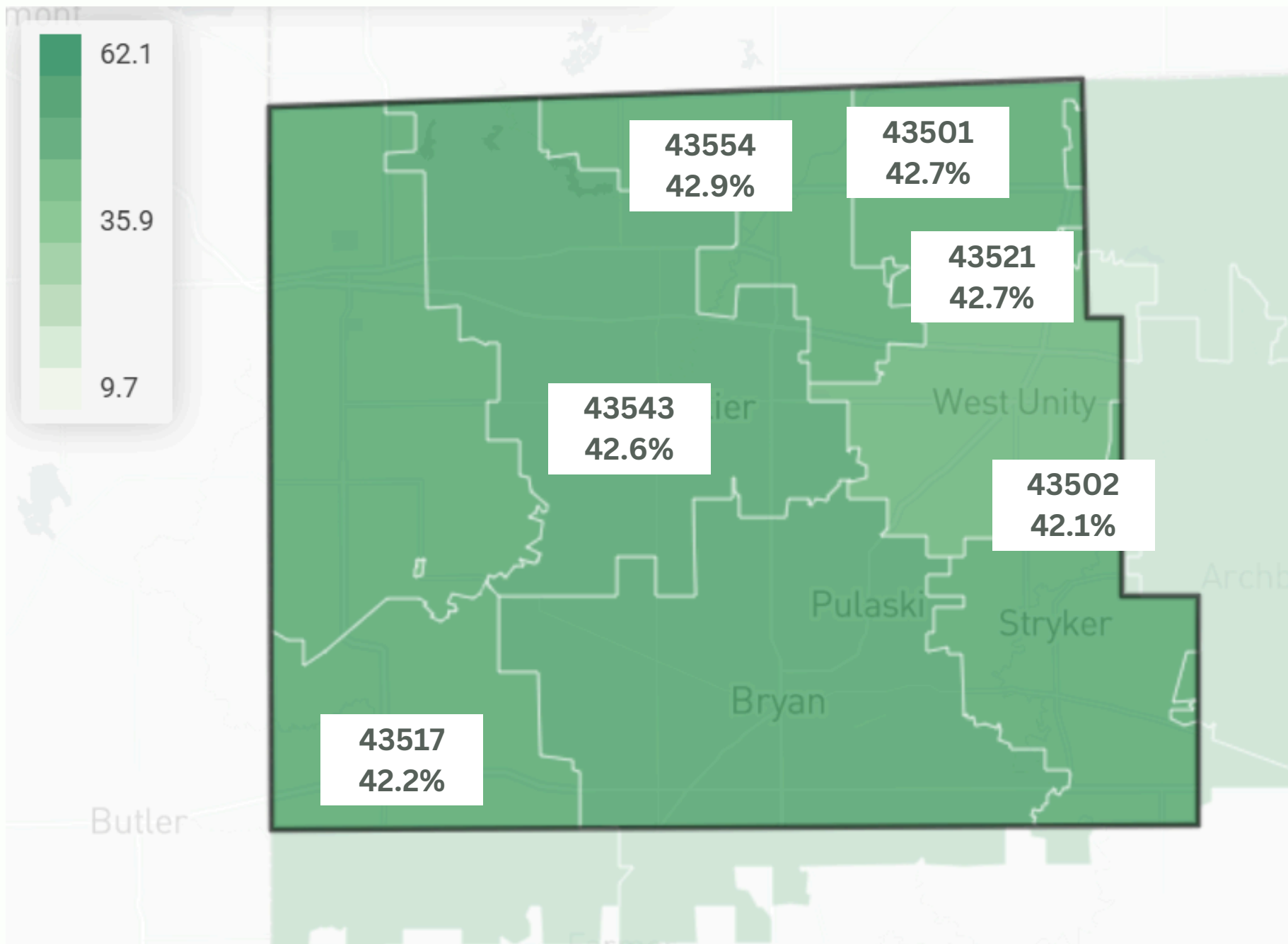

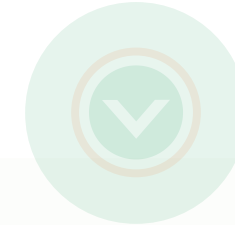
Obesity

- The percentage of adults with obesity in Williams County slightly decreased from 2021 to 2022 but has steadily been on the rise over time (**41.5% as of 2022**) and is higher compared to Ohio and the Parkview Health System service area.
 - Obesity rates are steadily increasing across all zip codes, with the highest percentages observed for zip codes **43501 (42.7%)** and **43554 (42.9%)**.

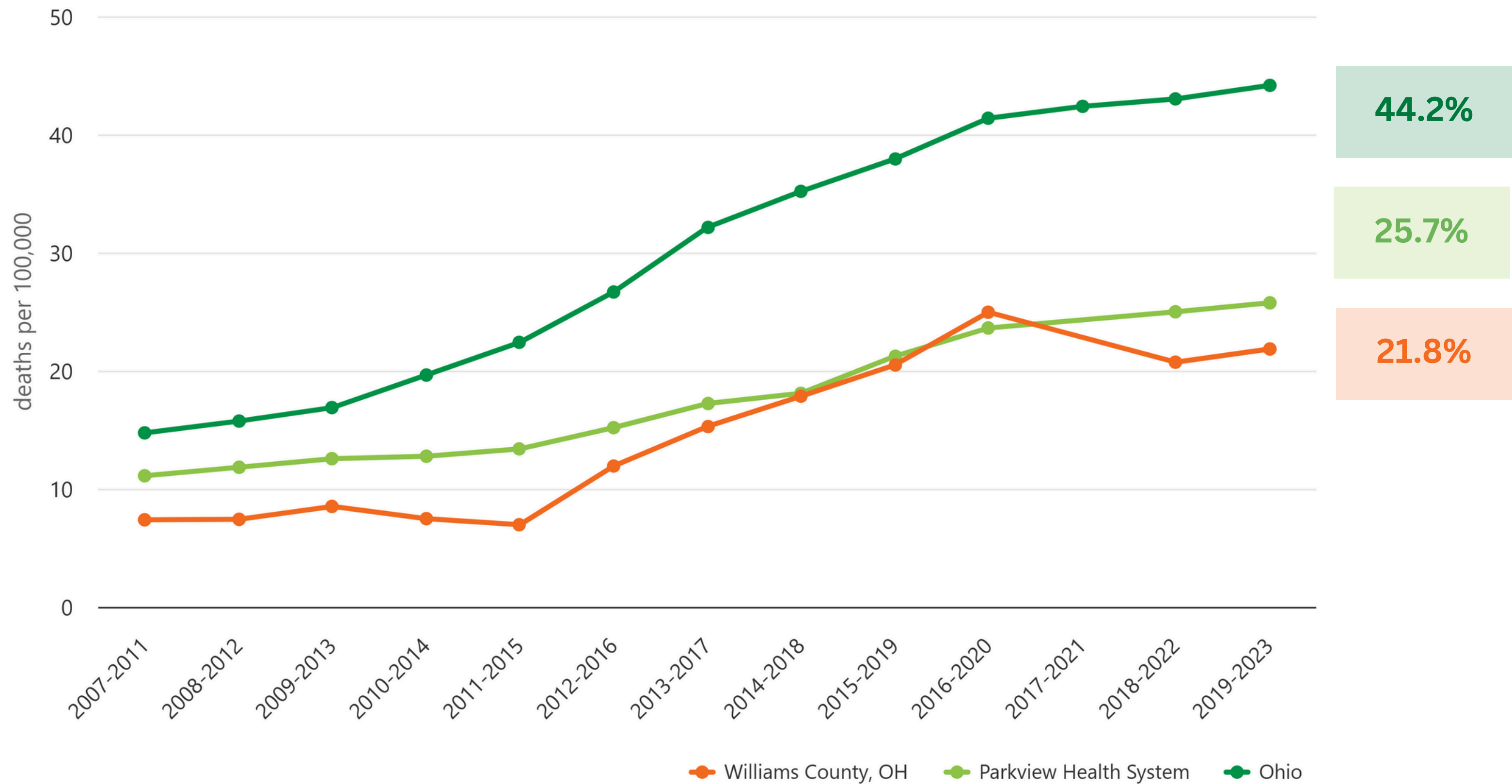

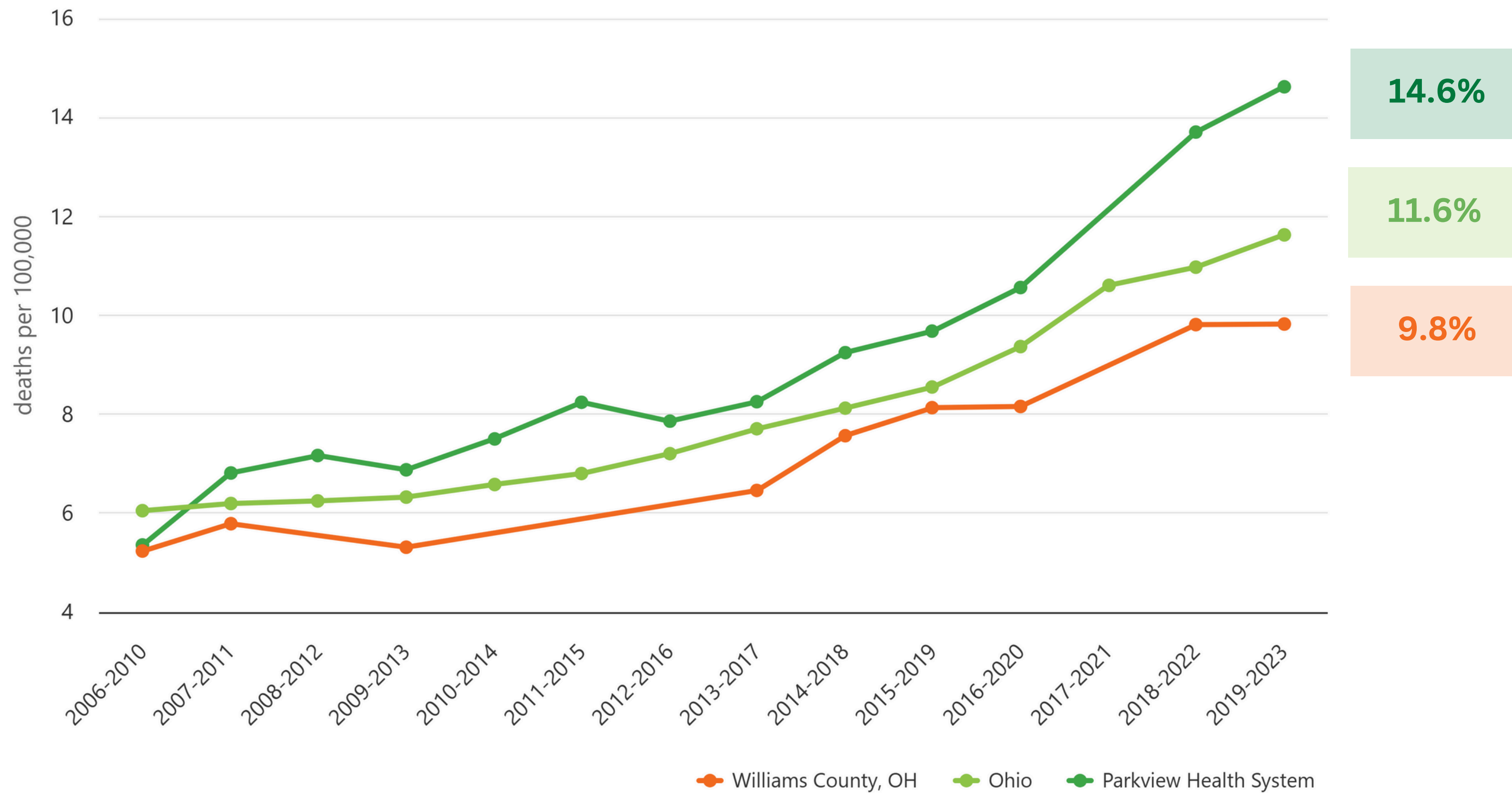
Drug overdose mortality

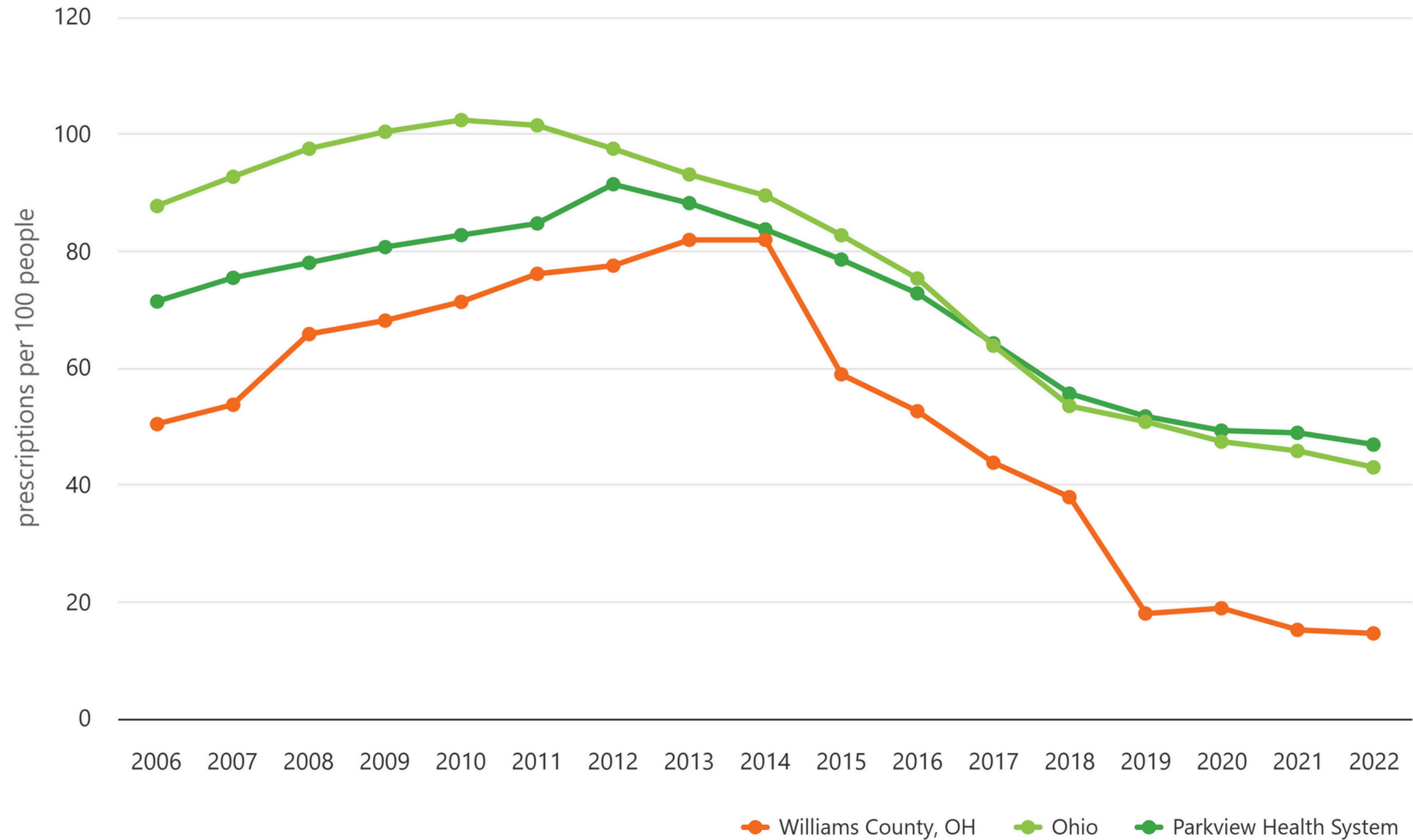
Alcohol-related mortality

Opioid Dispensing Rate

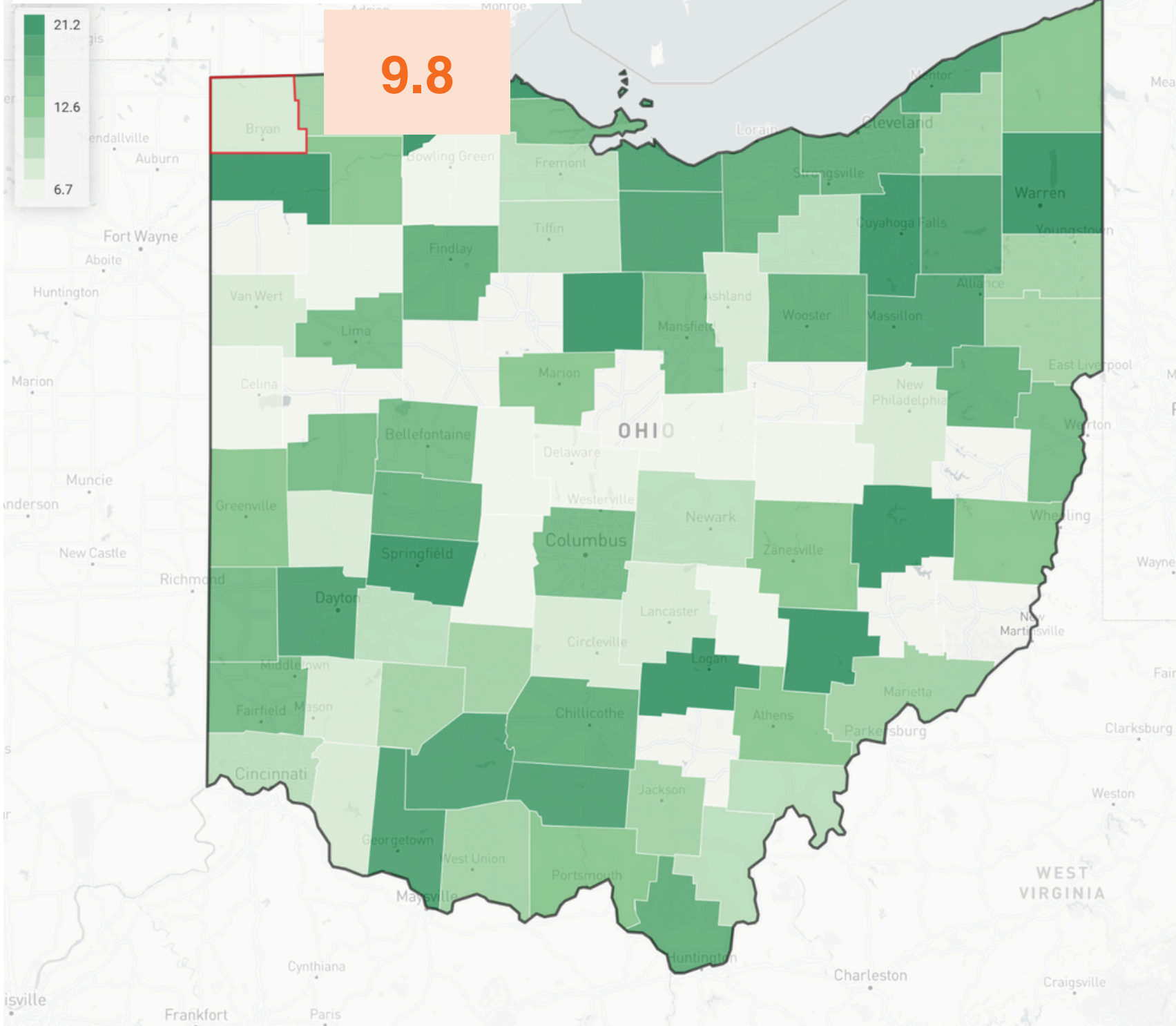

Summary of Community Survey Data and Local Health Statistics

Substance Use Disorder

- Although rates of alcohol-related mortality and drug overdose mortality have risen in recent years, rates in Williams County have stayed consistently lower than the averages in Ohio and the Parkview Health System service area.
 - Binge drinking among adults is on the rise and is higher in Williams County than Ohio and the Parkview Health System service area. Zip codes of most concern for binge drinking are **43501, 43506, 43518, and 43557**.
 - Opioid dispensing rate has decreased significantly over time, with Williams County reporting **14.6 prescriptions per 100 people**, more than three times lower than the averages in both the Parkview Health System and Ohio.
