

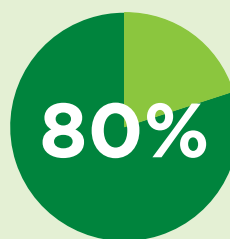

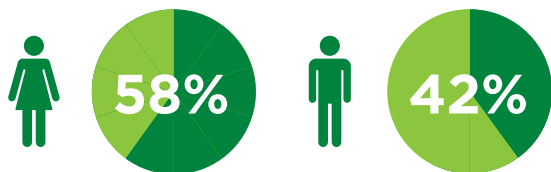

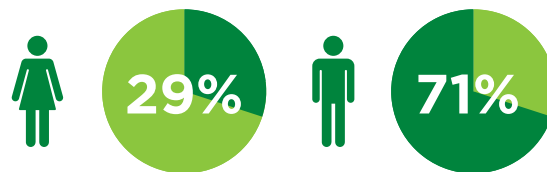

Program outcomes

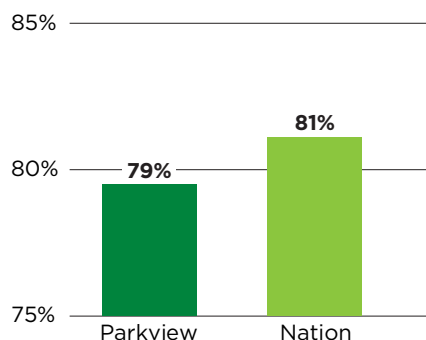
AVERAGE NUMBER OF THERAPY HOURS

The average number of therapy hours per day for all adult inpatients includes time spent in physical therapy, occupational therapy, and speech therapy. In 2025, patients participated in an average of 3.26 hours of therapy each day of a five-day therapy week.

DISCHARGE TO HOME OR COMMUNITY

At Parkview, our goal after a patient completes inpatient rehabilitation is to promote independence, postrehabilitation.

Seventy-nine percent of inpatient rehabilitation patients were discharged to their home or the community. The remaining 21 percent needed additional care at an acute care hospital setting or a skilled nursing facility.



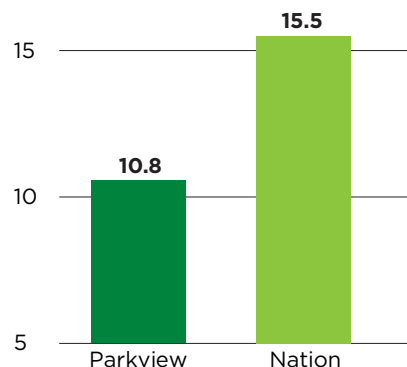
At Parkview, 100 percent of pediatric patients were discharged to their home or community.

Pediatric average inpatient stay: 14.9 days

Pediatric average of onset days: 33.5 days

CHANGE IN ABILITY TO CARE FOR THEMSELVES

Patients' self-care scores improved by an average of 10.8 points, which is evaluated at admission and discharge.



UNPLANNED TRANSFERS FOR ACUTE CARE

A patient may experience changes in their medical condition that would require them to be discharged to a medical floor. In 2025, the frequency of these transfers for patients at the Parkview Rehabilitation Center was 9.2 percent.
