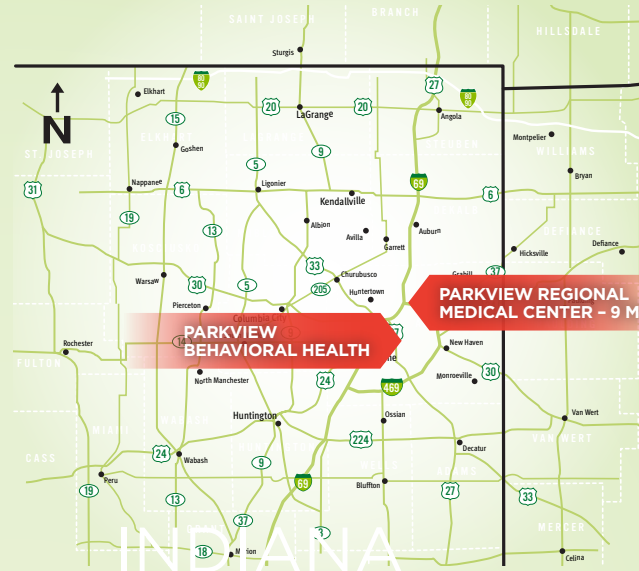
Park Center Founded: 1967

Psychiatric Inpatient Services Founded: 1970

Organizational Structure: Charitable, not-for-profit, community-owned hospital, has been a member of Parkview Health since 1997. In 2018, Parkview acquired Park Center, a Community Mental Health Center (CMHC), and Parkview Behavioral Health Institute was created to expand services in the community.

Beds: 105 Inpatient Beds

SERVICES/FACILITIES

Crisis Services:

- Parkview Psychiatric Emergency Services, located inside Parkview Hospital Randallia, provides crisis evaluations for Parkview Health.
- HelpLine is a 24 hours a day service in which experienced specialists complete confidential assessments and guide callers to the appropriate level of care or community resources, as needed.
- Assessment Center and Intake Services
- The SOS Mobile Intervention Team provides experienced specialists to provide mental health crisis intervention when someone is in a heightened state of crisis, providing resources, a safety plan and further assessment.

Acute Inpatient Services:

- Parkview Behavioral Institute has 105 beds and provides acute psychiatric inpatient services to children, adolescents and adults.

Outpatient Psychiatric and Therapeutic Services:

- Parkview Physicians Group provides psychiatric services in Allen County, including treatments for children, dementia, depression, eating disorders, PTSD and seasonal affective disorder.
- Intensive Outpatient Programs are available in Allen County at various locations. Services for adolescents and adults include mental health disorders, substance use disorder and eating disorders. Programs run two to three days per week for several weeks, depending on individual treatment needs.

Addiction Treatment:

- Parkview, in collaboration with its Community Mental Health Center, Park Center, offers Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) for opioid use disorder in Allen, Adams, Wells, Whitley and Wabash Counties.
- Outpatient programs are available in Allen County to help with addiction. Programs are based on the American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM) criteria that serve adult men and women. Care providers include a team of board-certified addictionologists, therapists and licensed addiction counselors.
- Parkview offers support groups, including Alcoholics Anonymous, Cocaine Anonymous and Narcotics Anonymous.
