About This Report

To grow and ensure the continued quality of Parkview Health's commitment to improving the health of our community, each of our licensed hospitals prepares a Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) and subsequent implementation strategy on a triennial basis. Using the knowledge gained from the 2025 CHNA results, this report will define Parkview Logansport Hospital's community health implementation strategy for the 2025–28 assessment cycle as federally required by the Affordable Care Act. In doing so, this report will:

- Define the community we serve
- Summarize the 2025 CHNA and implementation strategy processes
- Summary of how top health needs were prioritized
- How the hospital is addressing these community needs
- Describe unmet needs that were identified by 2025 CHNA

About Parkview Health

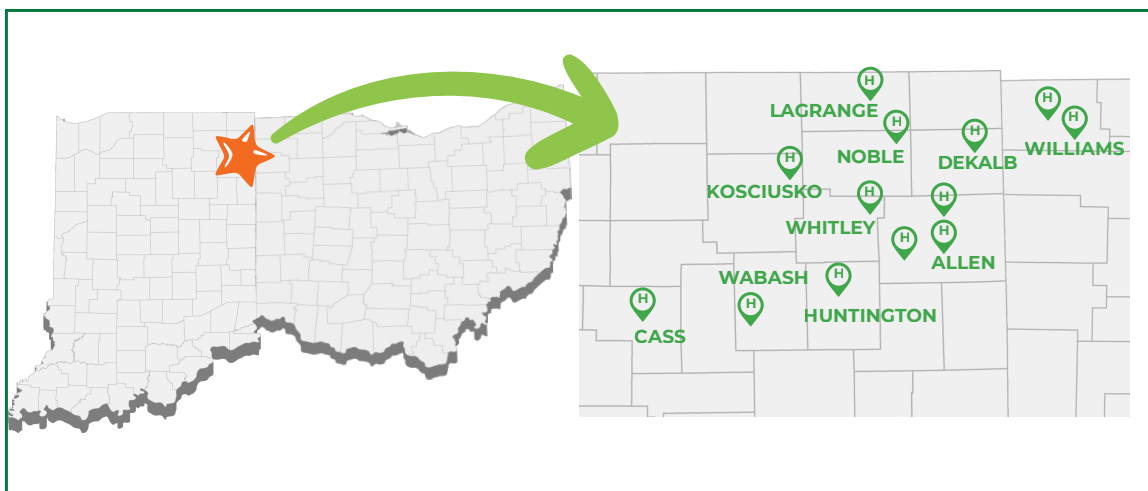
Parkview is a not-for-profit, community-based health system. It serves a population of more than 1.3 million in Indiana and northwest Ohio. With more than 17,500 employees, Parkview is the region's largest employer. Parkview started as Fort Wayne City Hospital and has been serving the community since 1878. Parkview Health formed in 1995, and the heritage of care and compassion continues today with 15 hospitals and over 300 outpatient centers and physician offices.

Parkview Health has a mission to improve health and inspire well-being in the communities we serve.

Community Served

For the purposes of this implementation strategy, the Parkview Health service area consists of the counties where a full-service Parkview hospital is located. This includes Allen, Cass, DeKalb, Huntington, Kosciusko, LaGrange, Noble, Wabash, and Whitley Counties in Indiana and Williams County in Ohio. Within this broader service area, the "Community Served" for this implementation strategy is defined specifically as Cass County, Indiana.

Cass County, home to Parkview Logansport Hospital, serves a population of 37,703 residents, according to the 2025 Parkview Logansport Hospital CHNA. The county's median household income is approximately \$56,403, with 12.7 percent of households living below the federal poverty level. Additionally, 7.2 percent of residents are uninsured. 2025 CHNA Process and Methodology

This assessment incorporates data from multiple sources, including primary research (through the PRC Community Health Survey and PRC Online Key Informant Survey), as well as secondary research (vital statistics and other existing health-related data). The overall process focused on understanding community needs, prioritizing the most pressing issues, and identifying available resources and gaps to guide strategic planning and improve health outcomes.

Primary Data

The survey instrument used for this study is based largely on the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS), as well as various other public health surveys and customized questions addressing gaps in indicator data relative to health promotion and disease prevention objectives and other recognized health issues. The final survey instrument was developed by Parkview Logansport Hospital and PRC and is similar to the previous surveys used in the region, allowing for data trending.

Secondary Data

A variety of existing data sources were consulted during the CHNA process, including: Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, US Census Bureau, National Cancer Institute, Center for Applied Research and Engagement Systems, US Department of Agriculture, US Department of Health and Human Services, US Department of Justice, and US Department of Labor. Combining this data with the surveys for comparison provided a comprehensive view of the community's landscape. This secondary data offered valuable insights into health behaviors, outcomes, and social factors. Once all data was analyzed, the top significant health needs were ranked based on a prioritization exercise conducted among providers and other community leaders (representing a cross section of community-based agencies and organizations) as part of the Online Key Informant Survey. This list was then shared with Parkview Logansport Hospital to select three priority health needs for 2025-28.

Prioritization Overview

After gathering and analyzing the data—including gathering input from individuals whose organizations work with low-income, minority, or other medically underserved populations—Professional Resource Consultants (PRC), senior leadership and the board used a structured process to pinpoint the community's most urgent health needs. This process was meant to be inclusive and data driven, ensuring that the chosen priorities represented both community members' experiences and health trends. The process involved an online survey with community stakeholders and final selection of top health needs by hospital leaders.

Online Key Informant Survey

- Key informants were invited to participate in an online survey regarding topics such as major current community needs, gaps in service, and perceptions of problem severity.
- Key informants were selected based on community roles and knowledge of area health needs. A selection of approximately 146 were invited to participate and 64 community representatives took part in the survey.
- Key informants were professionals who provide a wide range of services to the community from diverse backgrounds.
- Results from the key informant survey were presented for prioritization.

Selected Health Priorities

PRC presented in-depth survey findings and a summary to Logansport Senior Leaders, Logansport Quality Team members, and the Parkview Health Community Health Improvement Team. The teams reached a consensus and listed recommendations on health priorities, taking into account hospital resources and overall alignment with the hospital's mission, goals, and strategic priorities. These recommendations were submitted to the Logansport Board of Directors prior to the monthly board meeting for consideration and review. On November 24, 2025 the board approved the following health priorities.

Selected Priorities for Parkview Health - Cass County

- Access to Mental Health and Addiction Services
- Access to Healthcare Services
- Infant Health and Family Planning



Implementation Strategy Process

In addressing each prioritized health issue identified above, Parkview Logansport Hospital created the following implementation strategy to define how the hospital intends to address each selected health need on the previous page, in addition to our ongoing commitment to improving access to care. This collaborative planning process includes senior leadership, the hospital board, Community Health Improvement staff, program leads, community nurses, community health workers, and partner organizations working alongside the results of the 2025 CHNA. Through this process, we work diligently to align the top health needs of our community with hospital resources and capabilities to create our implementation strategy in compliance with the requirements set by the Internal Revenue Service for tax-exempt health systems and hospitals.

Parkview Logansport Hospital's board, made up of hospital board members, hospital leadership, and community stakeholders, reviewed and adopted the implementation strategy on April 27, 2026.

2026 Implementation Strategy

This section will report the strategies and program initiatives the hospital will implement, fund, or pursue in collaboration with community partners to address priority health needs over the next three years.

All planned activities align with the hospital’s mission, priorities, and operational capacity. The plan is intended to be flexible and may be revised as circumstances evolve, including changes in community needs or available resources.
