Founded: First hospital established in 1902; current facility opened in 2000

Organizational Structure: Charitable, not-for-profit, community-owned hospital; member of Parkview Health since 1995

Size/Campus: 136,532-square-foot hospital and 34,396-square-foot medical office building, on 35-acre campus. The hospital completed a 20,430-square-foot expansion for rehab and wound care in 2019. Hospital amenities include a chapel, a café and a gift shop.

Beds: 36

Medical Staff Members: 288 physicians; 75 advanced practice providers

SERVICES

Emergency Department: full-service, 24-hour emergency department with eight treatment rooms, one trauma bay and a “safe room” for patients who may be experiencing a behavioral health crisis. Specifically trained to meet the needs of cardiovascular, trauma and neurological emergencies.

Surgery: two surgery suites and one endoscopy room, eight private and semi-private pre-op/post-op rooms and three recovery room bays; 24-hour coverage. Surgical services include general surgery, orthopedic, gynecological, colorectal, podiatry and more. Laparoscopic and endoscopic procedures performed.

Medical/Surgical/CCU: 30 inpatient rooms, six of which are intensive care rooms with remote monitoring capability enabling physicians to monitor patient vital signs, access chart information and provide diagnoses in real time. Telehealth capability for cardiology patients.

Family Birthing Center: six private labor/delivery/recovery/postpartum rooms, breastfeeding support, 24-hour rooming-in for infant bonding, special care nursery, advanced fetal monitoring system, supportive services for expectant and new moms.

Holly D. Sale Rehabilitation and Wellness Center: physical, occupational and speech therapy for adult and pediatric needs; sports medicine; manual therapy; lymphedema therapy; vestibular rehab; cardiac and pulmonary rehab; breast cancer pre-/post-treatment assessment; nutritional counseling; diabetes education; and fitness center.

Sleep Disorders Lab: diagnosis and treatment of sleep-related disorders in adults and children. All-new sleep lab opened late in 2019. Home sleep studies also available.

ATU Clinic: outpatient monitoring and dosing of certain blood-thinning medications.



Physicians Specialty Clinic: houses specialty physicians who travel to Huntington on scheduled weekday(s) to accommodate the needs of patients for consultation visits, follow-up visits and/or procedures for cardiology, colorectal, neurology, urology, nephrology, pain management and pulmonology.

Diagnostic Services: 3-D mammography, 3-D and 4-D ultrasound, CT scan, MRI, nuclear medicine, cardiopulmonary procedures, EKG, EEG, DEXA scan, HeartSmart CT scan, SmartLung CT Scan, vascular screening, fluoroscopy and laboratory procedures.

EMS: paramedic ambulance service operated by PHH for Huntington County and surrounding areas.

Medication Infusion Unit: features a dedicated RN; specializes in outpatient medications, infusions, transfusions and central line care; lab draws available.

Parkview Physicians Group: primary care and specialty services on the hospital campus and in several locations in Huntington County.

Parkview Center for Wound Healing: coordinated care for treatment of chronic, non-healing wounds. Opened in late 2018, center includes two hyperbaric chambers and clinically proven treatment options. Experienced physicians, nurses and staff trained for chronic wounds.

Parkview Huntington Foundation: fundraising entity for Parkview Huntington Hospital.
