Parkview Physicians Group: Six physicians formed a primary care department of Parkview Hospital in 1995; in 1997, 43 affiliated physicians established Parkview Medical Group (PMG). In 2009, PMG became Parkview Physicians Group (PPG) with the acquisition of primary care physicians; specialists in cardiovascular and colorectal surgery; and OB/GYN. Now, PPG includes nearly 900 providers in more than 40 specialties in more than 100 locations throughout northeast Indiana and northwest Ohio.

Parkview Research Center: A research function participating in national and international medical research; that brings the newest technology and medical breakthroughs to the Fort Wayne area.

Parkview Signature Care: A PPO (Preferred Provider Organization) network available to self-funded and fully-insured employers, with providers throughout the state of Indiana and northwest Ohio serving 50,000 members.
